	GEOGRAPHIC LANDSCAPE	San Francisco has a wealth of resources for people living with HIV (PLWH). Most service centers are focused in the Mid-Market/Tenderloin neighborhood. Approximately 16,000 PLWH reside there.	
	THE CHALLENGE	San Francisco has become infamous for its ever-present homeless population and its extreme unaffordability. Our largest challenge is the lack of necessary resources to transition clients into permanent residences.	
	FOCUS POPULATION	Our two primary populations for the first three years of this program are clients who are transitionally housed or engaging in services at 129 Hyde (Larkin Street Youth Services) and 410 Eddy (Lutheran Social Services).	
Ø _o	THE MODEL	Clients of both transitional housing sites receive Housing Benefits Counseling, a service not readily available in the city unless clients already have subsidy or section 8 vouchers. Clients are met where they are, physically and emotionally. Our goal is to be a low barrier program to help clients find permanent housing and employment as well as access and engage in their HIV care.
