National Network for Advancing Systems of Services for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs Year 1 Accomplishments



What We Did:

Conducted a needs assessment to determine key stakeholder priorities.

- Reviewed 10 Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Block Grants that identified a need for technical assistance in medical home, transition, and financing
- Led 2 focus groups and conducted a survey with 17 MCH Title V/Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) Directors and designees regarding preferences for initial Network project(s)
- Interviewed 12 family leaders and 1 youth leader about needs, gaps, and priorities for CYSHCN



What We Found:

71% of Title V/CYSHCN programs identified and 100% of families endorsed care coordination as a top priority.

- Title V/CYSHCN programs identified the need to:
 - Reduce silos and duplication among systems and programs
 - Increase access in rural areas and address health equity
 - Increase funding/reimbursement for care coordination
 - Increase family-centered care across services
- Family and youth leaders identified the need to:
 - Better define what care coordination means in practice
 - Improve measurement of care coordination
 - "Coordinate" the care coordinators among various services and programs
 - Integrate care coordination across systems



What Comes Next:

Identify innovative activities, best practices, and technical assistance strategies to support states in improving or enhancing their care coordination efforts for CYSHCN and their families.
