










# Intersectionality

## Intersectionality & Oppression

- Hierarchy of oppression (e.g. feminism must be addressed above racism)
- Bell Hooks: "In Western culture, all forms of oppression are linked and supported by the cultural belief that the superior should control the inferior."
- Ezekiel Dixon-Ramon: "Intersectionality is less about identity and difference and seeks to deconstruct and disrupt the discourse of identity and difference."
- Focus on the social processes of systems of oppression themselves, which produce these varied identity categories and difference


